PROGRAM UPDATES:

Samantha Smith- (Program Manager, OSAP) Stated that the Prescription Take-Back Event will be held on September 25, 2021 once again in conjunction with the City & County Household Hazardous Waste Day. Coalition trainings have been taking place over the last two weeks and planning is underway for the Teens In Action event coming up on October 2nd Downtown. She also mentioned that a fentanyl awareness campaign is in the works to be rolled out soon, to include sharing local stories whose lives have been affected by drug abuse. Joana went on to explain the Neighborhood Watch Program to the group in attendance and the positive affects they have on the community (i.e. crime reduction, etc.). In the past, they have hosted a Neighborhood Night Out events, but with COVID still an issue this year, she explained for 2021 the Coalition will be hosting a Teen Night downtown in conjunction with the Firefighter Combat Challenge in October. DJ Overcomer from Dallas, TX is going to play for the teen event.

Tiffany Shirley (Program Manager, SPF/PFS) – Expanded on the above mentioned as well. She went on to cover the fundraising efforts and amounts for the K-9 campaign, adding that Chevron has been a big supporter with the recently acquired Chevron Catalyst Grant.

Julie Fuentes (Program Manager, STOP/TOP/Teen Court) COVID restrictions are still limiting programs from entering the schools. TOP is in motion at JMA School and things are going well there. Eddy County Teen Court is continuing to run. Yesterday evening the program saw three cases. Joana explained the schedule of the program and said that they are looking for youth attorneys currently. Mia Vasquez suggested advertising the need for attorneys at the Carlsbad High School.

OLD BUSINESS:

Parents in Action now has new training materials. Staff reported that they are looking for adult groups to present to.
