Factoid of the Month:

KETAMINE HYDROCHLORIDE is a quick-acting anesthetic that is legally used in both humans (as a sedative for minor surgery) and animals (as a tranquilizer). At high doses, it causes intoxication and hallucinations similar to LSD.

Sometimes Called:

K, Special K, vitamin K, bump, cat Valium, Kit Kat, Super acid, Purple

How It's Used:

In different forms, ketamine can be snorted, swallowed, smoked, or injected. Users often use it along with other drugs such as Ecstasy (called kitty flipping) or cocaine or sprinkle it on marijuana blunts.

What It Does:

People who use ketamine can become psychologically dependent on it to feel good, deal with life, or handle stress.

Users may become delirious, hallucinate, and lose their sense of time and reality. The trip — or K-hole — that results from ketamine use lasts up to 2 hours. Users may become nauseated or vomit, and have problems with thinking or memory.

At higher doses, ketamine causes movement problems, body numbness, and slowed breathing. Overdosing on ketamine can stop breathing and cause death

TREASURY REPORT: Joana Wells

PROGRAM UPDATES:

Joana reported on the Coalition's award of the federal grant for 1.5 million dollars. This grant will be 'shared' with Carlsbad Police Dept. for outreach related to underage drinking activities, drug use, and to address other deviant behaviors. Grant funds may also be used to shape a community policy/ordinance changes in the community. The Coalition's implementation of health programs in classrooms will be virtual at this time due to COVID. The grant does not need to begin to be spent until January 2021, so there is time to feel out the best way to begin implementation of programs. Media campaigns are being looked at, including the digital billboard at Carlsbad Community of Hope.

Teen Court Update: Brandon Carrasco and Hannah Kim

Brandon reported that a meeting was held with Teen Court trainees regarding ordinances that usually come through the court. Hannah reported that they are working on strengthening the attorney's defense and prosecution. Mock trials have been held for practice as well. Participation has been pretty good from the attorneys during the COVID pandemic.

STOP: Tiffany Shirley

Coalition staff attended meeting last week for program updates for online implementation. They are working towards putting Prevention in Motion and All Stars programs online as well. National Association of SRO's training update from Joana: Will be made available online. Joana stated the Coalition is expanding with the awarded grant, and will be hiring three new positions.

Preventionist: Julie Onsurez

Julie reported that she has been working with Carlsbad PD on an interactive virtual social learning parent group. It will be a way for parents to have access to support and educational resources.

Jason Shirley inquired about an ordinance discussion earlier in the meeting and the funds assigned towards community policy/ordinance changes in the community. Joana explained the Coalition has years of data to support a local social host ordinance introduction in Carlsbad.

NEW BUSINESS/ANNOUNCEMENTS:

Joana reported that we are looking for 2 new Executive Board of Director positions. The Coalition has not had a faith based representative in quite some time and would be interested in reaching that aspect of the community.
